MINUTES: The minutes of the previous meeting were approved without revision.

CORRESPONDENCE: Two scholarship applications were received and turned over to the Scholarship Committee. The Leeds VA facility thanked the detachment for hosting a Bingo party, with pizza and birthday cake, for hospitalized veterans. The American Cancer Society asked for a donation.

REPORT OF THE PAYMASTER: The report for January was accepted unanimously.

SICK OR IN DISTRESS: Stan Lachtara was welcomed back after a lengthy absence, in a weakened but improved condition. Ted Buckhout is ailing, feeling better one day and worse the next, according to Commandant Buckhout. Precautions to avoid contracting Coronavirus were reviewed.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS (those not listed had nothing to report or were absent or excused):

Commandant: Commandant Buckhout, along with Senior Vice Commandant Delaney, will participate in the Bataan Memorial Death March at White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico on March 15; the march is 26 miles through the high desert and is held in memory of the service members who died defending the Philippines in World War II. The detachment received a bill from the City of Westfield for over \$11,000 (repeat: \$11,000) for costs related to the December sewer backup and its aftermath; this will be protested. The scholarship dinner is approaching and raffle donations are needed. Detachment members are urged to sign up for flag pin sales on Mother's Day weekend (May 8, 9, 10) and Father's Day weekend (June 19, 20, 21. The Westfield Memorial Day parade will be on May 25 and volunteers are sought for the color guard. The state convention is scheduled for June in Hyannis; sign up if you are interested. Volunteers for this summer's Westfield Fair will be needed; now is the time to plan for that. Any change in an email address should be reported to the web sergeant. Detachment members are reminded to pay their dues; the simplest and easiest way to stay up-to-date is to become a Life Member

Judge Advocate: The state department said our detachment's revised bylaws meet established standards; final approval is expected soon.
